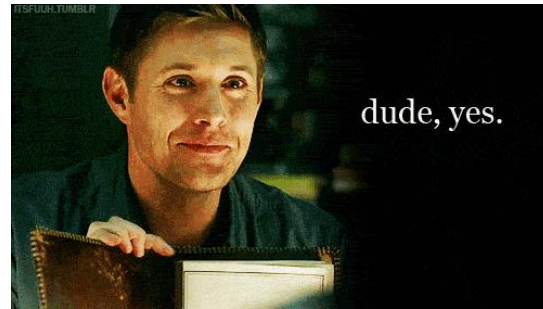

English Program

All Grade 11s **MUST** take 8 courses:



- **English Language Arts 11:** Composition, Creative Writing, Literary Studies, New Media or Spoken Language
 - Select 1 as “R” (required course) and any others as “E” (elective course)
- **Mathematics 11:** Workplace Mathematics 11, Foundations of Mathematics 11 or Pre-Calculus 11
 - Accelerated students choose 1 or more of: Foundations of Mathematics 12, Pre-calculus 12 and/or Calculus 12
- **Science 11:** Life Sciences 11, Chemistry 11, Earth Sciences 11 or Physics 11
 - Grade 12 courses also fulfill this requirement: Anatomy & Physiology 12, Chemistry 12 or Physics 12
- **Social Studies:** Explorations of Social Studies 11, 20th Century World History 12, Physical Geography 12, Law Studies 12, Philosophy 12 or Social Justice 12
- **Plus 4 electives.** Many students will choose to take more than the minimum required academic courses. Electives at this level are considered to be any courses above and beyond what is required for graduation.

French Immersion Program



All Grade 11s **MUST** take 8 courses:

- **English Language Arts 11:** Composition, Creative Writing, Literary Studies, New Media or Spoken Language
 - Select 1 as “R” (required course) and any others as “E” (elective course)
- **Langue et culture de la francophonie 11**
- **Mathematics 11:** Workplace Mathematics 11, Foundations of Mathematics 11 or Pre-Calculus 11
 - Accelerated students choose 1 or more of: Foundations of Mathematics 12, Pre-calculus 12 and/or Calculus 12
- **Science 11:** Life Sciences 11, Chemistry 11, Earth Sciences 11 or Physics 11
 - Grade 12 courses also fulfill this requirement: Anatomy & Physiology 12, Chemistry 12 or Physics 12
- **Social Studies:** Sciences humaines 11 or any of : 20th Century World History 12, Physical Geography 12, Law Studies 12, Philosophy 12 or Social Justice 12 - if you choose to go the English route for SS11 credit, you must also take Science de l'environnement 12 to get your Double Dogwood.
- **Plus 3 electives**

On the Course Registration Page

- Select a course as “R” if it is a REQUIRED course for your post secondary pursuits.
- Select a course as “E” if it is an ELECTIVE course and has no impact on your post secondary pursuits.
- Select a course as “A” if it is an ALTERNATE course - admin and counsellors will review if all other elective choices are full.

Language Requirements



- You do NOT need a second language to graduate!
- A second language 11, such as French, Spanish, Punjabi or Mandarin, is required for 1st year direct entry (straight from high school) into some universities.
- If you are a native speaker of a language other than English, you may choose to write a Language Challenge Exam. You must be able to both read, write and speak the language. Registration for these exams is in October and they are written the following January. Challenge exams are NOT accepted for university admission, but credits count towards graduation.
- Some students will choose to take a language 12 online (or Core French 12 at Burnsville) to boost their admission averages. Online courses are accepted for university admission.

Course Registration

- It is the choices that YOU make during the course selection process that drive teacher timetables and course availability.
- Instructions on how to register for your courses are on the BurnsvieW Website, Parent Connect and Student Connect.
- Choose 8 courses, plus 2 alternates. Rank your alternates so that if a course is unavailable, counsellors know which one to prioritize.
- There are no study blocks for grade 11s.
- The deadline for course registration is: February 19 at 4 p.m. until March 1, 2019.



How do you Graduate?



- Credits start accumulating in grade 10.
- You need a minimum of 80 credits, 20 of which MUST be at the grade 12 level.
- All courses at Burnsville are worth 4 credits each.
- If you take a full course load in grades 10 and 11 and 7 courses in grade 12, you'll have 92 credits.
- External credits may apply. You need high level certification in: music, dance, sports, cadets, scouting, languages, lifeguarding, driver's ed courses, Duke of Edinburgh, Girl Guides and/or much more.
- In October of your grad year, your counsellor will complete a grad check to make sure each grad has met the requirements to walk across that stage in a cap and gown.

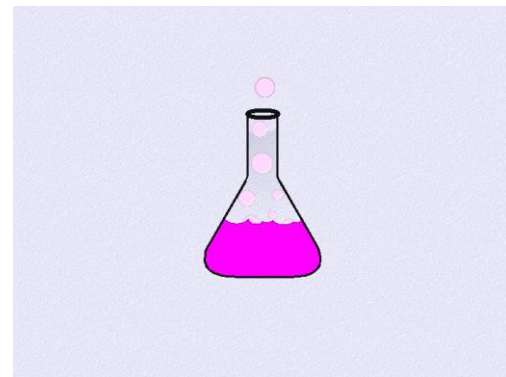

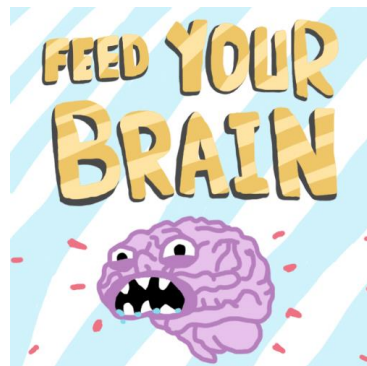


Grade 11 Courses

Grade 12 Courses



- English Studies 12
- Career Life Connections 12
 - This is not Graduation Transitions 12 with a new name; in addition to the curriculum package to work through, students will also be required to compile 30 hours of experience towards a Capstone Project.
 - The purpose of the Capstone Project is for students to demonstrate the knowledge, competencies, and passions that they can offer the world as they integrate personal interests and strengths with future possibilities.
 - There are also 30 hours of paid work experience and/or volunteering.
- Français Langue 12 (if in French Immersion)
- 5 or 6 electives
- If you pass 8 courses in grade 10, 8 courses in grade 11 and 7 in grade 12, you would have 92 credits.
- 80 is the minimum for graduation.

Numeracy and Literacy Exams

Literacy Exams:

- All students are required to write it in grade 10 **AND** grade 12.
- Students have the opportunity to write it up to 3 times. The best score will be recorded.

Numeracy Exams:

- All students will be required to write it in grade 10.
- Students have the opportunity to write it up to 3 times. The best score will be recorded.
