# 2. Principal's Message - Don Younger

# Creation of a school vision

Our staff has been examining our school and has worked through a rating system to look at seven components that are evident in schools that are strong learning organizations. We have been following a guide from OECD – education branch that has examined top performing schools in countries that rank high in the PISA rankings. BC and Delta are within the top performing schools in the world.

From this ranking we have determined that while we have many great things happening at Burnsview, we do not often talk in the terms of School Vision and as such may have some differing understandings as to our vision and focus.

We are spending time to bring our staff together, discuss what is important for our students to be learning and how we can be working towards the same goal.

# <u>April Exam period</u>

Earlier this year schools were presented with the information that the numeracy and literacy exams required for grade 10 students have been moved from a June writing period to now being available to write in April. As such, we will be needing to run an altered schedule for 4 days – April 14 - 17. To make this time valuable to students, we expect our schedule to consist of:

- 2 morning classes occurring on each of the 4 days (allowing us to cover all 8 blocks)
- Activities in the afternoons dependent on the grade level

# <u> Mental Health Curriculum – Grade 9</u>

Multi-lesson program to educate students about mental health, knowing the difference between feelings and mental health issues, how to support each other and how and where to get further support.

Curriculum comes from Dalhousie university and has been in place for 3 years in North Van.

We ran the curriculum last year and have found it very good in educating our students about Mental Health issues.

Currently 14 staff have taken training to enable them to deliver this program. In addition, two of our teachers have also attending a 3-day course at UBC based on the curriculum. We will be implementing the program for grade 9 students in April.

Burnsview has a learning support teacher who is fluent in French who can now assist with learning strategies for immersion students who need to access supports. There is ample evidence that alternate learning needs should not hold a student back from choosing immersion.
