Types of Career Programs

- a) Youth Work in Trades
- b) Youth Train in Trades
- c) Work Experience 12A/12B



Youth Work in Trades

- Can start at age 15
- Begin training in an apprenticeship program while in high school
- Get paid while working under a **Red-Seal** Journey Person
- Earn credit towards graduation (up to 16 credits) and hours towards their apprenticeship



Youth Train in Trades

- Students in grades 11 & 12 (must apply while in grade 10 or 11)
- Receive Level 1 of the school based Industry Training in high school
- Earn credits towards graduation and post-secondary (dual credit)



Work Experience 12 A/B

- ❖ Students in grades 11 & 12 (sign up in during course selection)
- ❖ 90 or 180 hours of volunteer work related to the student's career goals
- ❖ Gain real-world experience and employability skills
- ❖ Earn 4 or 8 high school credits, depending on hours volunteered

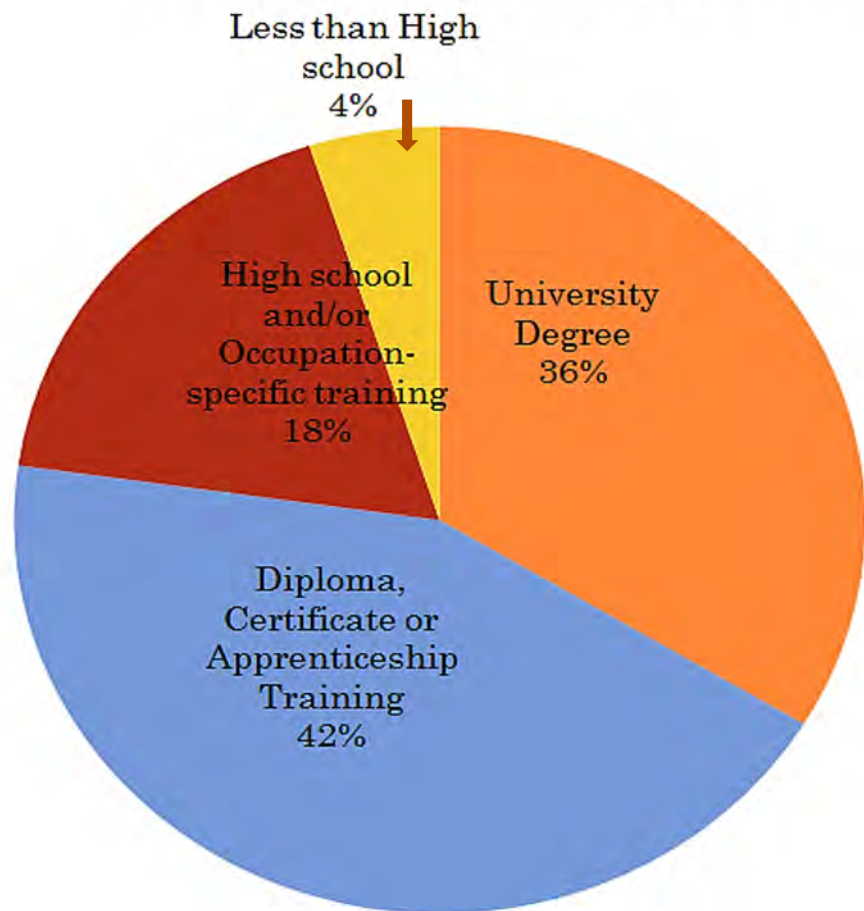

Research Intensive universities

- Students should focus on academic courses in grades 11 & 12
 - A minimum of 5 in grade 12
 - A language 11 will keep more options open
- Some schools will allow students to re-take courses, some won't
 - As a rule the Ontario schools are less generous in allowing 2nd attempts at classes
- Spares are not looked at favorably
 - These universities want to see that you can succeed academically with a full course load
