Semester 2 Transition

The final day for Semester 1 classes will be Wednesday, January 26th. Thursday, January 27th is scheduled as an "I Day/Transition Day". Friday, January 28th is a non-instructional (Pro-D) day with January 31st and February 1st also scheduled as "I Days/Transition Days".

The "I Days/Transition Days" provide opportunities for students who are presently not passing to "catch up" on missing assignments or tests and demonstrate their learning of the expected course outcomes. Teachers will be communicating with students and their families if the student is expected to attend classes on these days. An "I" plan to recover the course will be shared with the student. The "Transition Days" will also be used by staff to prepare for the start of Semester 2 on February 2nd.

Cancellation of January write of Graduation Exams

From the Ministry of Education:

FOR INFO, SUPERINTENDENTS, DIRECTORS OF INSTRUCTION, PRINCIPALS/VICE-PRINCIPALS, AND TEACHERS – Cancellation of the January 2022 Provincial Graduation Assessment Administration Session: Due to the ongoing challenges presented by the pandemic, the January administration session of the provincial graduation assessments is cancelled. No Grade 12 students who are on track to graduate in the 2021/22 school year will be impacted by this cancellation. Further information on upcoming sessions will be provided by mid-February, including a question and answer document to support conversations with students and parents.

Q1: Why did the Ministry cancel the January 2022 Graduation Assessment session?

A1: Over the past few months, grade 10 and 12 provincial assessments have been impacted significantly by work force capacity issues and the ability to address technical issues within the electronic assessment system. The capacity issues for the Ministry and e-assessment service provider teams have been exacerbated as of late by COVID-19 Omicron variant. Due to these ongoing impacts, the Ministry made the difficult decision to cancel the January administration of all grade 10 and 12 provincial graduation assessments.

Q2: Which assessments are included in the cancellation of the January administration session?

A2: All graduation assessments (Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, Literacy 12) are included for both English and French within the cancellation of the January administration session. Typically, there are four session where students can write assessments (November, January, April and June). This cancellation only pertains to the January session.

Q3: When will students have another opportunity to write these assessments?

A3: Information regarding upcoming sessions (April and June 2022) will be provided by mid-February. No Grade 12 students who are on track to graduate in the 2021/22 school year will be impacted by this cancellation.

Incident:

Earlier today, a student witnessed a man displaying lewd behaviour in a path north of Burnsview Secondary, near the end of 77th Avenue. They reported the incident immediately to school staff who called the police.

The Delta Police Department responded quickly, however the suspect had left the area. The police have a description of the suspect and are canvassing the neighbourhood as part of their active investigation into this incident.

This incident is a reminder for all of us to always focus on safety and simple precautions needed when in a public place. We ask that you please remind your child of the following:

- Arrange to walk with a friend to school
- Do not talk to strangers
- If you are approached by a stranger, go to a public place or yell for help
- Tell a trusted adult as soon as possible
