Here 4 Peers

Here4Peers is a youth-driven, evidence-based, Mental Health Awareness Program which involves training older grade 10-12 "peers" from high schools to facilitate an interactive workshop to grade 7 classrooms in catchment elementary schools.

The Here4Peers workshop is a 140 minute workshop designed to complement prescribed learning outcomes from the BC Physical and Health Education "Mental Wellbeing" curriculum, and includes interactive games, multi-media, as well as small and large group discussions in its delivery.

Our students have been meeting weekly to learn the curriculum and develop their presentation skills. They have had two training sessions with the H4P facilitators and are now at the stage of practicing their presentations with our Gr. 8 classes before presenting to Gr. 7 classes. We expect the presentations to start in February.

Timetable for the 2023/24 school year

We are once again at the time of determining our timetable for the next school year. The current semester format was put in place district wide 2 school years ago in response to the pandemic restrictions. For the 2023/24 school year, schools have been tasked with determining the timetable format that we will be following. We are currently working through a process with our teachers to determine the key objectives/drivers of the timetable. From the comments collected through last year's Parent and Student surveys, we believe that we understand their objectives.
