CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

One course is 4 credits

A minimum of 80 credits is required for grade 10, 11 and 12

→ 16 of which (= 4 courses) must be at the grade 12 level

→ 4 of which (= 1 course) must be of Indigenous (First Peoples) Content

External credits may apply: High Level Music, Dance, Sports, Cadets, Scouting, Languages, Lifeguarding, Driver's Education Courses, Duke of Edinburgh, Girl Guides, etc.

Grad check will be done by your counsellor in grade 12 to make sure you have met the requirements to walk across the stage in a cap and gown

Provincial Assessment Requirements For Graduation

- 1) Grade 10 Literacy Assessment → in January
- 2) Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment → In April
- 3) Grade 12 Literacy Assessment → In November
- 4) Grade 12 French Provincial Assessment → In January (???)*

Assessments are electronic, 2 - 3 hours

Students are registered for the assessments automatically

Students can rewrite assessments up to 3 times to improve their scores

*In addition, French Immersion students will be required to write this assessment
